Chapter 7: As for This Moses

1. (pp 103-104) Do you think Moralistic Therapeutic Deism has served as a major religious framework for accepting the teachings of Richard Rohr and the Enneagram? Why or why not?
2. (p. 109) The fourth-century heresy known as Pelagianism views humanity as basically good. Where do you see this belief reflected in our culture? In the church?
3. (pp. 109-110) The story of Sarajane Case's departure from Christianity began with uneasiness over her LGBTQ friends not feeling at home in her church. Do you know of anyone who has left the church or who rejects Christianity because biblical doctrine doesn't condone this or some other lifestyle or practice?
4. (pp. 116-119) The authors use several passages of Scripture to describe the responsibility of church leaders for guarding against false teachers, and for believers to grow in maturity in discerning truth from error. Did you find this section helpful/encouraging? Why or why not? Is it more daunting or frustrating than encouraging? Explain.
5. (pp 119-121) The authors' response to the concern that unbelievers might be offended by sound biblical teaching is that church is primarily for believers, not unbelievers. Were you surprised by this response? After reading their explanation, did you agree or disagree?
