## **Chapter 6: Counterfeit Revival**

- 2. Which, if any, of the following 13 signs of counterfeit revival (from pp. 103-116) have you personally experienced/witnessed? What was your reaction?
  - 'Ministry time' and 'activation'
  - Revelation of divine strategies for building God's Kingdom (Seven Mountain Mandate/ruling over all major spheres of society)
  - 'Gospel of the Kingdom' (claim that believers have authority to rule the earth and that the gospel is confirmed with signs and wonders)
  - Promises that God will fulfill your dreams/make you prosperous
  - 'Victorious (or apostolic) Eschatology' (the view that Christians will experience great victory in the end times by performing signs and wonders, causing worldwide revival)
  - Decrees and declaration 'prayer'
  - 24/7 prayer rooms (those which use declarations for revival to bring about the 'billion-soul harvest' and releasing God's judgments)
  - Referencing revival hot spots (Lakeland, Toronto, Brownsville)
  - High regard for shady prophets (Bob Jones, William Branham, Paul Cain)
  - Fresh revelation
  - Casting out 'territorial spirits'
  - Claim that Jesus performed all his miracles as a man in right relationship with God through the power of the Holy Spirit (not by using his divine powers)
  - Encounters with angels
